Dear Restoration Reviewing Agency Members:

Mosaic Fertilizer met with members of the Restoration Reviewing Agencies (RRA) on May 17, 2005 to review permits and orders that were issued as part of the Riverview Phosphogypsum Stack expansion project. These permits outline the steps for requesting changes and/or extensions through the RRA for restoration activities. Representatives from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Hillsborough County Planning and Growth Management, and Environmental Protection Commission of Hillsborough County were present at the meeting. Southwest Florida Water Management District, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, and the US Army Corps of Engineers were unable to attend the meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to determine the appropriate method for requesting a time extension for the Archie Creek relocation.

Together, Mosaic and the RRA team members determined that a hard copy letter should be sent from Mosaic to the RRA outlining the need for the extension along with a revised project schedule. The RRA also recommended that an electronic .pdf file or a site alert be emailed to each agency to help expedite the review process. The RRA process provides for electronic approvals and agency comments via www.cargill-neb.com. While some agencies were comfortable with this process, it was determined that some agencies would prefer to execute hard copy approvals or comment letters. RRA members agreed to evaluate their preferred review and approval method within their respective agencies.

This letter is being sent to summarize the results of the May 17, 2005 RRA meeting as well as to formally request a one year time extension for the completion of the Archie Creek reroute. Project approvals that may be impacted by this request are as follows:

- Development Order #242
- Environmental Resource Permit #29-01583313-001
- EPC Authorization
- US Army Corps Permit #199902004(IP-JB)

This request for a time extension is being made due to 1) delays in the rerouting of the Florida Gas Transmission pipeline, and 2) a request by Hillsborough County to produce additional plans for the culvert crossing on old US Hwy 41 prior to the reroute of the creek. The Archie Creek project is approximately 90 percent complete. A revised project schedule to complete the Archie Creek reroute is as follows:

Gas Pipeline reroute completed April 2005
Exotics Vegetation control in new creek bed on going
Submit detailed plans to Hillsborough Co. for the culvert crossing
Complete Creek Reroute December 2005
Complete Planting May 2006
Project Completion June 2006

All other permit requirements have been completed within the timeline provided by existing permits and approvals, as reflected in the final restoration summary report and the annual report.

Mosaic requests that any comments regarding this request be sent through www.cargill-neb.com, the central repository for this project or through DEP, the lead agency assigned in the permits. We respectfully request the lead agency to consolidate any comments and forward them on to Mosaic for inclusion in the website database. Finally, we request that hard copy approvals be sent to Mosaic at the following location:
